### ***What Is Salvation?***

Everybody sins. That means that all people do things they know to be wrong. (*Romans 3:23*)

The punishment for sin is death— eternal separation from God. It doesn't matter if you've only sinned a little bit or if you've sinned a whole lot. The punishment is the same. (*Romans 6:23*)

Everyone who has faith in Jesus is saved and becomes a child of God. (*John 1:12*)

God saves us by grace through our faith. That means that there's nothing we can do to earn God's salvation. God gives it to us as a gift because he loves us. (*Ephesians 2:8-9 and Titus 3:5a*)

God sent his perfect Son, Jesus, to take our punishment. Jesus died for us so that we can have eternal life. (*John 3:16 and Romans 5:8*)
